End of Year Health Office Reminders:

- If you have well-child visits scheduled over the Summer please remind your pediatrician to send an updated physical form to the school to keep on file.
- All incoming 7th grade students **MUST** have a physical/well-child exam and be up to date with immunizations for entry.
- All student medications must be picked up by the end of day on June 17th, the last day of school by an adult. Medication can not be sent home with the student in their backpacks unless it is an inhaler or epi-pen. Any medications not picked up will be disposed of by the end of day on June 17th. Please call and make arrangements to pick up any remaining medications.
- If your child will need medication dispensed during school hours next year a new [Permission to Dispense Medication form \(here\)](#) must be filled out again by their pediatrician/PCP prior to the first day of school and be dropped off by an adult.
- If your child has an inhaler please have their pediatrician send an updated [Asthma Action Plan. \(here\)](#) Be sure to have a new inhaler and a spacer ready to bring and keep at school for the first day even if you think your child no longer needs it.
- If your child has an epi-pen please have their pediatrician fill out the [Medication Order for Students With a History of Allergic Reactions form \(here\)](#) and be sure to have a new, unexpired epi-pen to keep at school the first day.
