Dear JFS Parents and Guardians,

We are coming to the point where we need to plan for how education will look from January through the end of this school year. When we provided the option for families to elect either a face-to-face or distance model of learning for the fall, we indicated that we would reassess our conditions and needs to plan for education after December.

As of this message, we have been successful in keeping our students in school by following the protocols and plans developed in the SAU 9 Re-entry Plan. We expect that mask wearing will continue to be a significant factor in keeping our students and staff safe. The current structure of educational delivery is centered on small groups of students (cohorts of 10-12) with minimal transitions throughout the day. Transportation provided by the district currently limits the number of bus riders to 24-26 students physically distanced and with assigned seats. Sanitizing and cleaning is continuous at the building and individual level. When we have had positive cases of COVID-19 among our students and/or staff, following these protocols and implementing contact tracing has been key to minimizing the number of quarantined individuals.

Conditions related to COVID-19 may force schools to transition from face to face to hybrid or remote scenarios, but we would like to put structures and programming in place to reasonably meet the needs of our students and families.

We will be reaching out to families of our distance learners to determine their desires for education for their children beginning in January. Knowing the number of our current distance learners who want to return to face-to-face learning will be critical to our planning.

Depending upon the number and grade level of the return to school students, there may be the need to increase cohort sizes, place current distance learners in schools other than their neighborhood schools, implement a hybrid model at one school, or restrict transportation to students who live a certain distance from school. Increasing cohort sizes may impact the ability to keep students 6' socially distant from one another.


If your child is currently accessing their education face-to-face and you are thinking you would like to move to a distance model from January through June, please contact me at 356-5381 or email me at [d\\_nutting@sau9.org](mailto:d_nutting@sau9.org). Families of our current distance learning students should expect to receive a phone call prior to Thanksgiving break.

Thank you for your continued support and flexibility as we work together to provide education during these challenging times.


