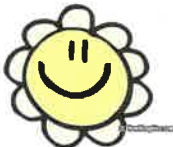

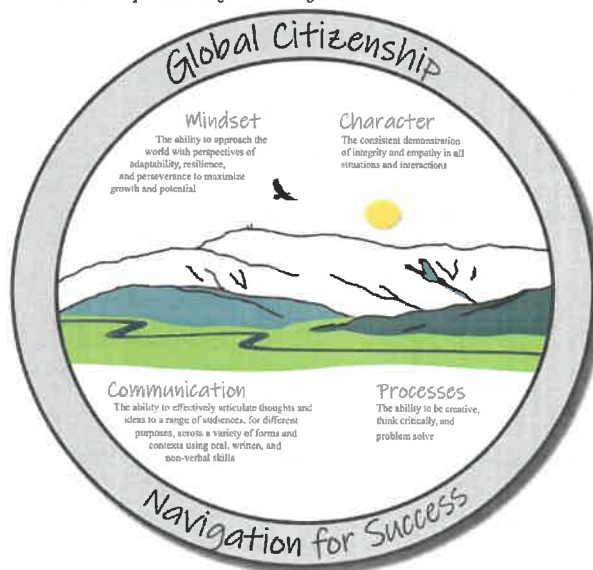
Dear JFS families,

Hello John Fuller families!

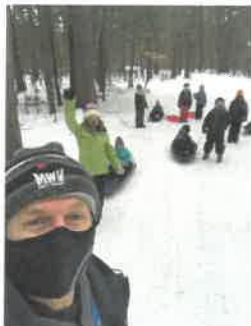

We anticipated muddy fields this spring so we created a PE game cart for indoor PE. It's been a big hit! It's been really fun and engaging for all the students. Scrabble, Chutes and Ladders, puzzles, Yahtzee!, Sorry, and 10,000 Legos for constructive play time within our cohorts. We seemed to have made the seamless jump into spring and of course everyone is thrilled to have dry fields for learning and play.

Motor Skills and object control skills are top priority for us at JFS PE throughout the entire third trimester. Catching and throwing a ball correctly is an amazing feeling and accomplishment. Striking a ball from a tee and throwing a Frisbee well is inspiring to a young student. These are a few great examples of object control skills. Motor Skills with an emphasis on locomotors are of equal importance this spring. Skipping, galloping, and especially sprinting with great form are essential activities for every child. The students are practicing on their own time at recess and at home and the results are impressive! Developing object control skills along with locomotor skills gives every child access to more activities with confidence.

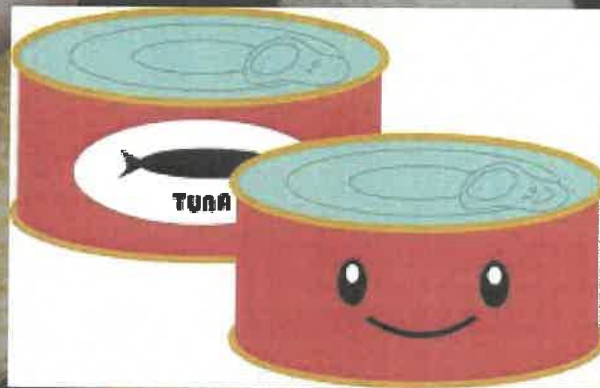
