



# ARP ESSER Health and Safety Plan Guidance & Template

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Section 2001(i)(1) of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires each local education agency (LEA) that receives funding under the ARP Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund to develop and make publicly available on the LEA's website a *Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan*, hereinafter referred to as a *Health and Safety Plan*.

Based on ARP requirements, 90 percent of ARP ESSER funds will be distributed to school districts and charter schools based on their relative share of Title I-A funding in FY 2020-2021. **Given Federally required timelines, LEAs eligible to apply for and receive this portion of the ARP ESSER funding must submit a Health and Safety Plan that meets ARP Act requirements to the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) by Friday, July 30, 2021, regardless of when the LEA submits its ARP ESSER application.**

Each LEA must create a Health and Safety Plan that addresses how it will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff, and which will serve as local guidelines for all instructional and non-instructional school activities during the period of the LEA's ARP ESSER grant. The Health and Safety Plan should be tailored to the unique needs of each LEA and its schools and must take into account public comment related to the development of, and subsequent revisions to, the Health and Safety Plan.

The ARP Act and U.S. Department of Education rules require Health and Safety plans include the following components:

1. How the LEA will, to the greatest extent practicable, implement prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning;
2. How the LEA will ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services;

3. How the LEA will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff and the extent to which it has adopted policies, and a description of any such policy on each of the following safety recommendations established by the CDC:
  - a. Universal and correct wearing of [masks](#);
  - b. Modifying facilities to allow for [physical distancing](#) (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);
  - c. [Handwashing and respiratory etiquette](#);
  - d. [Cleaning](#) and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving [ventilation](#);
  - e. [Contact tracing](#) in combination with [isolation](#) and [quarantine](#), in collaboration with State and local health departments;
  - f. [Diagnostic](#) and screening testing;
  - g. Efforts to provide COVID-19 [vaccinations to school communities](#);
  - h. Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and
  - i. Coordination with state and local health officials.

The LEA's Health and Safety Plan must be approved by its governing body and posted on the LEA's publicly available website by July 30, 2021.\* The ARP Act requires LEAs to post their Health and Safety Plans online in a language that parents/caregivers can understand, or, if it is not practicable to provide written translations to an individual with limited English proficiency, be orally translated. The plan also must be provided in an alternative format accessible, upon request, by a parent who is an individual with a disability as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Each LEA will upload in the eGrants system its updated Health and Safety Plan and webpage URL where the plan is located on the LEA's publicly available website.

The ARP Act requires LEAs to review their Health and Safety Plans at least every six months during the period of the LEA's ARP ESSER grant. LEAs also must review and update their plans whenever there are significant changes to the CDC recommendations for K-12 schools. Like the development of the plan, all revisions must be informed by community input and reviewed and approved by the governing body prior to posting on the LEA's publicly available website.

LEAs may use the template to revise their current Health and Safety Plans to meet ARP requirements and ensure all stakeholders are fully informed of the LEA's plan to safely resume instructional and non-instructional school activities, including in-person learning, for the current

school year. An LEA may use a different plan template or format provided it includes all the elements required by the ARP Act, as listed above.

\* The July 30 deadline applies only to school districts and charter schools that received federal Title I-A funds in FY 2020-2021 and intend to apply for and receive ARP ESSER funding.

The LEA will monitor the latest recommendations from PDE, PADOH, and CDC and update their Health and Safety Plans as needed. Plans will be presented to the governing Board for approval when changes are necessary. Facilities and practices will be adapted to the extent possible to ensure that appropriate prevention and mitigation processes are followed.

Educational models will be adapted to the needs of the students as appropriate including virtual if needed. Social, emotional, mental health and other needs will be monitored and provided by school health providers, social workers and other mental behavior specialists when needed. Food service will be provided using various models as appropriate to the situation, including the availability of free meals if needed for students throughout the entire year.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Modifying facilities to allow for <a href="#">physical distancing</a> (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To the greatest extent feasible, student desks and workstations will be spread out when students are doing individual work. Cooperative groups will remain constant where possible. Student assemblies will be minimized to essential items.</li> <li>• If spread of the virus becomes a limiting factor for students to be in school, the A/B hybrid model from the previous year can be enacted.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="#">Handwashing and respiratory etiquette</a>;</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CDC signage will be displayed throughout buildings on proper handwashing and cough/sneeze etiquette. School nurses will attend grade level meetings to reinforce these etiquettes with students.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="#">Cleaning</a> and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving <a href="#">ventilation</a>;</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Classroom unit ventilators will be set for code required outside air infusion. Filters will be changed quarterly at minimum. Classrooms, cafeteria, and all areas where students convene will continue to receive daily cleaning and disinfecting with quaternary based solution.</li> <li>• Windows will be open as much as possible to stimulate the flow of outside air.</li> <li>• Additional disinfecting in high traffic areas will be reinforced as needed.</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="#">Contact tracing</a> in combination with <a href="#">isolation</a> and <a href="#">quarantine</a>, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• School nurses, secretaries, and building principals will continue to conduct direct contact tracing and will isolate students who are known close contacts until parents or guardians pick up the students.</li> <li>• Required quarantine times will be reasonably enforced as directed by PA DOH. Communication with the DOH will occur as needed.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="#">Diagnostic</a> and screening testing;</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students and staff who are ill will be advised to stay home. Students and staff becoming ill during the school day will be directed to the school nurse for symptom and temperature screening. The nurse will then contact parents with an advisement.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Efforts to provide <a href="#">vaccinations to school communities</a>;</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The schools will continue to coordinate with community health partners to facilitate voluntary vaccination clinics for the health and convenience of our students and families.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students with disabilities documented in an Individualized Education Plan or Section 504 plan will continue to receive tailored accommodations deemed necessary, appropriate, and feasible by their case managers, School Psychologist, Director of Special Education, and/or their Multi-Disciplinary Team as a whole.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Coordination with state and local health officials.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Superintendent will continue to meet regularly with Intermediate Unit Executive Director, IU Staff, and other school leaders in the Four County region. Additionally, school nurses will attend county-wide school health meetings (if available) on a regular basis.</li> </ul>
